Risk

The Elliot Foundation Academies whilst unaware of all of the employment terms of conditions of its supply chain is low risk for enabling modern slavery

- 81% of the organisation's turnover is spent on its own staff who are employed according to national standard terms and conditions set out in the National Conditions of Service for Teachers in England and Wales ("Burgundy Book) and the National Agreement and Pay and Conditions of Service for support staff ("Green Book") and burgundy books
- The Trust is committed to paying the Real Living Wage and London Real Living Wage
- Trustees have also committed the Trust to achieving Living Wage Employer status which places a further obligation on ensuring that our supply chain pays the living wage
- The Trust works with all teaching and support staff unions through a National Joint Committee
- Our significant contracts are with RM Education, EPM, Browne & Jacobson, all of which were procured through OJEU compliant processes and Modern Slavery commitments were part of the tender process
- Catering contracts and catering supplies which are probably the area with the most significant risk are procured through ESPO or other DfE approved frameworks
